# TREASURES FOUND: ARCHAEOLOGY FROM THE EAST OF SCOTLAND

**Until 14 February | Daily | Free**

From a Bronze Age spearhead to Roman coins and a Medieval pilgrim badge, this exhibition of recent archaeological finds from the East of Scotland sheds a fascinating new light on the history of the area.

Museums in Fife, Edinburgh, Scottish Borders and East and West Lothian have come together to create an exhibition of items obtained through Treasure Trove. Under Scottish Law, ownerless objects found by chance – whether by metal detecting, field-walking or archaeological excavation – become property of the Crown and can be claimed as Treasure Trove.

## IN THE EYE OF THE STORM

Until 14 February | Daily | Free

Dive into this wonderful exhibition of seascape paintings from the museum collection, which explores artists' fascination with the sea in all its many guises. From the tempestuous surge of stormy waves to the gentle lapping of the sea on sun-kissed shores, the sea has inspired painters from John Duncan and S J Peplow to John Bellany and Joan Eardley.

Some choose to paint it purely for its own beauty, without people, boats or land to ground it, while others like to portray its power by placing people at its mercy. The centrepiece of the show is ***The Storm*** by William McTaggart, arguably Scotland's greatest seascape artist, who depicts a dramatic attempt to save people from a sinking ship.

# KIRKCALDY ART CLUB EXHIBITION



The town of St Andrews was a major centre of European pilgrimage in the Middle Ages, when thousands of pilgrims journeyed there to see the relics of the apostle St Andrew in the Cathedral. Why not make a trip today to St Andrews Museum to find out about this and other fascinating stories from the past? Our long term display, **A St Andrews A-Z**, includes rare medieval pilgrim badges, 4,000 year-old arrowheads, 19th century banners and an executioner's axe!

St Andrews Museum is in Kinburn House which was built in the mid 1850s. It was named after a Crimean War battle and later opened as a museum in 1991. Located in Kinburn Park, the museum is next to tennis, bowling and putting activities. Our first floor gallery hosts temporary exhibitions and you can relax in our ever-popular **Café in the Park**.

# THE GLASGOW BOYS A SPIRIT OF REBELLION

Linked by friendship and a shared desire to rebel against the artistic traditions of late 19th century Scotland, the Glasgow Boys became one of the most significant groups of painters working in Britain at that time. A loose association of around 20 artists, many of them went on to enjoy critical acclaim and commercial success, both at home and abroad.

The exhibition looks at the evolving style of the Glasgow Boys and their impact on the art world. Included are works from our collection by leading members of the group and many others associated with it, including Arthur Melville, John Lavery, E A Hornel, George Henry, James Guthrie, Joseph Crawhall, E A Walton, Alexander Roche and Thomas Corsan Morton.

Methil Heritage Centre is a community museum lying in the heart of Levenmouth, an area stretching from Leven to the Wemyss villages, and from Kennoway to the shores of the River Forth. Located in a former Post Office, the centre hosts a programme of changing exhibitions and events, as well as a tearoom and shop.

The long term display, **Levenmouth Lives**, offers a flavour of the rich heritage of the area. Evidence of life in early times can be seen by the Pictish carvings in the Wemyss Caves. In more recent times the village of Buckhaven had the second largest fishing fleet in Scotland and Methil was the most important port in Scotland for shipping coal that came from the many mines in Fife.

Only five Victoria Crosses were awarded to Fifers during World War One. This exhibition tells the story of one - Robert Dunsire - and it follows his journey from the coalfields of East Fife to his death in 1916 after the Battle of Loos, and the act of bravery that won him the very highest award that this country can bestow upon a person.

Heroism, community and remembrance are celebrated in this exhibition, which is curated by Methil Heritage Friends, assisted by Fife Cultural Trust and supported by the Heritage Lottery Fund.

*transFORM* draws together a group of 4 artists producing diverse work but with a shared underlying passion, their fascination with the human made world.

It may be a simple re-telling of a deeply personal and meaningful association with an object: An invitation perceived in the object to reuse it in a completely different way from its intended function: The celebration of the visual pleasure man made things give us, by accident or design: Or it may be finding something, and by putting it through another production process, transforming it beyond recognition.

Whatever their reactions, the artists also share a need to produce, to make things that in turn will elicit a new reaction. They also desire to share their work and their excitement about what they see and think, with each other and with an audience.

It may be 'look what you can do with this amazing thing I've found', or simply, 'I can't believe someone is chucking all that good stuff out...'


