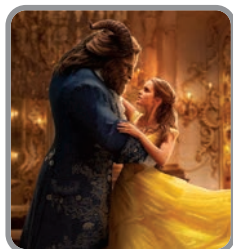


Viceroy's House

In 1965 he was dubbed “the white Martin Luther King” and the “high priest of anti-psychiatry” as he established Kingsley Hall in London as a medication-free community for those seriously affected by schizophrenia. His methods flew in the face of a medical establishment that considered Laing a dangerous radical.

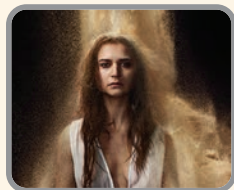
